#### **MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL**

Greetings Eagle Families and Friends,

Back in September, I shared that we started the new school year thinking about "impact" and how our individual and collective efforts could positively impact school climate, culture, and, most especially, academic achievement. We developed a solid school improvement plan with three focus areas: Learning (that includes teacher learning, too!), Interventions, and Connectedness. As we close in on the end of this school year, I take this opportunity to provide you with some highlights on our progress:

As part of our learning goal, we set a plan to improve student efficacy in twelve literacy standard areas. We believe in the research that shows how solid professional development translates into advanced student achievement. Therefore, we designed, created, and delivered literacy training to our certified staff. We have also begun to survey both teaching staff and students to compare and contrast the teacher and learner perspective of learning within these literacy standards. As a next step in our process, we will analyze the survey results and take a look at how each content area, including electives, uses "text" to advance literacy. One data point that we are using to gauge our success toward our learning goal is the SAT Suite of assessments. We are still waiting for some Spring administration results, but for a firsttime administration for everyone, results look promising, especially as we compare the October practice test results where 63% of our juniors met the PSAT benchmark score to the Spring administration showing that over 76% of our juniors met the SAT benchmark score.

In order to implement the second goal of this year's plan to enhance and expand our RtI continuum of interventions and supports, we developed and introduced a daytime intervention room that has been very successful in reducing exclusionary discipline and promoting student positive behaviors. Our goal was to reduce tardies and truancies by 7%; I am happy to report that we are on our way to surpass that goal by almost 4%, which demonstrates that with targeted intervention, our students respond.

To strengthen our ability to help our students socially, emotionally, and academically, we know we need a better understanding of our students' lives and backgrounds. We studied the concept of cultural competency at length and have developed a training that has been delivered to our administration staff and to our Guidance and Deans Departments. We also launched a new English Language Learner Student Advisory, comprised of 14 students who are relatively new to the United States and our educational system.

Their stories are powerful and will integrate into the training moving forward.

The last goal intends to improve school connectedness among staff and between all community stakeholders, including alumni. So far this year, we have upgraded and expanded our Athletic Wall of Fame that is installed outside the Eagle Gym; we have also installed an interactive Digital Hall of Fame which currently features athletic successes. We will be adding an activities component to these monitors as well. We have developed Hall of Fame induction criteria and will hold our first Hall of Fame event next November.

We re-examined the co-curricular interests of our current students and determined a need to advance two additional pilots - The Fashion Club and Cultural Connections. As a result, over 50 more students who had never been in any other activity are now co-curricularly involved.

To recognize notable alumni, we are developing a publication called "30 Under 30" to feature the successes of alum under the age of 30 years old. We expect to release this publication in early summer; at this point, the most difficult aspect of the project is limiting the publication to 30 alum!

These are just a few of the highlights of a plan that has definitely yielded intended results. We are proud of those results and feel a certain satisfaction when an external organization like US News & World looks at data based on their own criteria which ranks Sandburg among the best high schools in the Nation, State, and Southland. Our parent partnership toward our goals cannot be undervalued; without your ongoing support and encouragement, our efforts would not be as successful.

We are looking forward to a strong finish to this school year that includes a myriad of activities that take place in May, including Relay for Life, the Senior Party, Senior Scholarship Night, banquets and award celebrations, a host of regular and playoff athletic contests, and, of course, Graduation on May 23rd (rain date is May 26th).

I take this opportunity now to wish all of you a wonderful Memorial Day. This annual remembrance of those American servicemen and women who have died in service to our country is a wonderful opportunity to recall the many opportunities and blessings we have inherited because of those who lost their lives in defense of our freedoms. May we always be grateful for their sacrifice and honor their memory.


## **PSAT/NMSQT Testing**

#### (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test)

The PSAT will be administered to juniors in the fall of 2017. We will communicate the official testing date once it becomes available. This is a practice test used to assist students in preparing for the SAT. A student who does well on this exam and who meets other academic criteria may qualify for the National Merit Scholarship Program.

## **Senior Final Transcript Requests**

Since May 1 is the official date for seniors to notify colleges and universities of their official acceptance, there is no need to wait to request your final transcript!

Seniors should login to their <u>Parchment</u> account and place this request. Be sure to select "Hold for Grades," and our Registrar will submit your final transcript

once grades are posted. If your college or university is not listed in Parchment, we will obtain that information from your Senior Clearance Sheet on Check-Out Day and mail your transcript directly to their admissions office.

## **District 230 to Check Residency Annually**

In the district's ongoing efforts to be fiscally responsible, all District 230 students need to show proof of residency within the district boundaries on an annual basis, similar to when students first enrolled at Carl Sandburg High School. This procedure has been put into place to protect the financial interest of taxpayers in District 230 by assuring that the students who receive an education in our schools are legally entitled to do so.

The final day to complete this process will be held on Saturday, May 6, 2017 from 8:00 am-12:00 noon in the Commons. Please park in the West lot and enter through the W8 door (After Hours Entrance).

## **News From The Nurse's Office**

#### **Health Record Requirements For Incoming Freshmen**

According to Illinois School Code, all **incoming Freshmen** must have a complete physical prior to entry into high school, including an up-to-date immunization record before receiving a class schedule. All students are required to have:

- Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis series; Tdap booster
- Two (2) doses of measles, mumps, rubella vaccine (MMR)-1st dose having been given on or after the 1st birthday
- Polio vaccine series with booster given on or after the 4th birthday
- Two (2) doses of varicella vaccine (the 1st dose having been given on or after the 1st birthday)
- Three (3) doses of Hepatitis B according to the required schedule
- One dose of Meningococcal vaccine after the 16th birthday or two doses 8 weeks apart is required for all seniors

#### The form for the physical is two sided.

- Your physician must sign and date to verify immunization record and again after the physical portion with his/her stamp, including phone number.
- Parents must complete and sign a comprehensive health history. This is a mandated portion of the state's physical form and it is on the top of the second page of the physical. Please be sure that all signatures are present before returning your form to school.
- The nurse is required by law to RETURN any physicals NOT in compliance with the law. DOUBLE CHECK that all signatures are present.
- Always make a copy for your records.

#### Important reminders

- Each student must also have a pink emergency sheet on file in the Nurse's Office.
- Please remember that no student will be able to receive their schedule for the 2017-2018 school year until all medical records are in compliance with the state law and on file in the Nurse's Office
- Send your forms in as soon as they are complete to avoid a delay in getting your class schedule.
- The Nurse's Office is closed in the summer. Physical and emergency forms are available in the Main Office, Guidance Office or online during the summer.
- Dental Examinations strongly recommended but not required for entrance into school
- Completed forms should be mailed or turned into the Nurse's Office by May 20, 2017.

#### Reminder For Freshmen Athletes A separate sports physical is not needed for freshmen athletes.

If a student is planning to participate in a sport, his/her physical needs to be obtained on or after May 1, 2017 to assure eligibility for the complete school year.

- Please make sure the doctor circles YES for interscholastic sports.
- This must be done prior to the student trying out for a sport.
- Keep a copy, give a copy to your coach and send the original to the Nurse.

## ATTENTION Parents of Incoming Sophomore, Junior and Senior students:

If there are any changes in emergency contact or health information, please complete a new pink emergency form and turn it into the school nurse.

## SENIORS – Pick Up College Immunization Records

Seniors who need to provide a copy of their immunization record to their college should request a copy from the Nurse's Office by Friday, May 6th. The Nurse is not in during the summer and records are not available without advanced notice. Immunization records for students who do not pick them up will be given to students with their diploma.

#### Lost Eyeglasses??

The Nurse's Office has prescription eyeglasses that have been lost by students throughout the school year. Please have your student stop by the Nurse's Office before the end of the school year if they have lost or misplaced their eyeglasses. Any glasses left in our office at the end of May will be donated at the end of the school year.

#### Nurse's Office Alert Attention Junior Parents/Guardians (Class of 2018)

Two doses of Meningococcal vaccine are required for entry to the 12th grade.

Only one dose is required if it was given after the 16th birthday.

## The following action is needed from you at this time:

- If your child has received 2 doses of meningococcal vaccine, please bring your physician verified immunization record to the Nurse's Office.
- If your child received 1 dose after their 16th birthday, bring your physician verified immunization record to the Nurse's Office.
- If your child has not had this required vaccine, they must have it and bring the verification of having received it to the Nurse's Office.

If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the Nurse's Office at (708) 671-3118.

#### **Medications At School:**

Please pick up medications in the Nurse's Office by the last day of school. Medication not picked up will be discarded.

If your student takes medication at school, please remember to send a new Medication Form prior to the start of the 2017-2018 school year. This form needs to be updated each school year for your student to continue receiving his/her medication.
