

MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Greetings Eagle Families and Friends,

At this time of year, I reflect on the words from the famous philosopher, Seneca: Every new beginning comes from some other beginning's end.

While we are closing in on the end of this school year, we continue to harness all that we've accomplished over the year to plan for the future, including April highlights outlined below. Our potential is driven by our great desire to build confidence in our students to set and achieve goals and to use mistakes as learning experiences from which to grow. May ushers in many events and activities that celebrate our accomplishments this year and, for our seniors, the culmination of four years of hard work and achievement. While we focus on a smooth and productive end to the school year, we look forward to the next beginning of our collective journey.

The first-ever Senior Seminar on April 1st was a great success. Seniors spent the day rotating through several different sessions that focused on the transition to life after high school, including proactive tips on campus safety, budget management, packing for college, navigating roommate issues, housing contracts, digital footprinting, and a final session that motivated all to "Seize the Day" and leave a positive mark on the world. Our Guidance Department also coordinated the second Career Fair of the year on April 18th, which included a virtual welding truck. Several other trades booths participated to share information about career options.

Senior Josh Reeder took 2nd place in Engineering Graphics at state WYSE competition at the U of I on April 19th. He not only received a medal, but will also be awarded a scholarship to be applied to his engineering tuition at UIUC - the second one he's earned through Worldwide Youth in Science and Engineering (WYSE) while at CSHS.

On April 22, Sandburg's Top Secret event, Prom 0016 took place at the Field Museum where students were eager to make the night memorable. Once again, the small plate buffet provided prom goers with a delicious spread of options catered by Blue Plate. DJ Spinn made a guest appearance and our own DJ Wheathin's music was played as well.

On the very same weekend as prom, our SkillsUSA team competed in the 52nd annual Leadership and Skills Conference in Springfield. Student participants competed in ten different areas and I am proud to announce that we earned several medals, including two Gold for Lashai Michel and Faith Klier and two Silver medals for Tajah Ross and Stella Levin for Clothing Construction and Interior Room Design; and two Bronze medals to Josh Reeder and Cole Bateman in Additive Manufacturing and a Bronze to Yousef Ibrahim for Information Technology Service.

Sandburg's annual Spring Art Show opened at the end of the month. Student artists proudly put on display all their hard work on their interpretations and pieces. The rotating sets and sustained British accents of this year's musical, "My Fair Lady," amazed audiences throughout the run. Our Music Department is preparing for events including Spring Band, Choir, and Orchestra concerts. We appreciate the opportunity to honor students for their richly deserved achievements in the Fine Arts.

Our Parent-Faculty-Student Association (PFSA) recognized our staff with a lovely "Superhero" themed luncheon on Monday, April 25th. I especially want to thank Colleen McCurdy and Terry Dyrda for their service to the PFSA this year. We very much appreciate their services and leadership.

Advanced Placement Exams begin Monday, May 2nd and continue through May 13th. Traditionally, our students have done exceedingly well and we expect no less this year. To illustrate, Sandburg has repeated its status as one of America's most challenging high schools by the Washington Post. According to the recognition criteria, which includes AP testing data, Sandburg lands in the top 8 percent of schools in Illinois. We wish our students well in this year's efforts to earn eligibility for college credit through the College Board exams.

Almost simultaneously during the second week of AP exams, our seniors will launch into their final semester exam schedule. On the heels of that schedule is our underclass final exam schedule. These tests are part of the evaluation process and do affect each student's final grade and transcript. We hope this end brings success for the next academic beginning for all of our students. We also hope that all of our students continue to do their academic best right up until the end, (which for seniors is May 13th).

Semester Exams

Semester Exams for graduating seniors will take place on May 11th through May 13th. All other exams will begin on Friday, May 20th and continue through Tuesday, May 24th. All students are expected to be present for all examinations. Any exceptions must be requested – in writing – to Mr. Smith, Associate Principal, immediately in order to accommodate the necessary special arrangements. Please note that there is a \$53.00 charge per exam taken outside of the regularly scheduled exam periods.

Relay For Life

The Relay For Life of District 230 will take place on Friday, May 6th through Saturday, May 7th at Carl Sandburg High School. This year will be the 19th anniversary of the District 230 Relay For Life. To date, our event has raised over 3.75 million dollars in the fight against cancer, making it the largest high school Relay For Life event in the United States!

Relay For Life is the signature event of the American Cancer Society. All donations go to support their mission of helping people to

stay well, get well, find cures and fight back. This is accomplished through prevention/early detection programs, direct patient services, research and advocacy work.

Skills USA

SkillsUSA students competed in the 52nd annual Leadership and Skills Conference in Springfield this past weekend. Sandburg students competed in the following ten areas:

Additive Manufacturing (3D Printing), Adobe Photoshop Design, Architectural CAD, Cabinetmaking, Clothing Construction, Commercial Baking, Information Technology Service, Interior Room Design, Preschool Teaching Bulletin Board, and Technical CAD.

Students had previously qualified for the State Competition by taking a qualifying exam. In Springfield, students competed in their areas by completing real-world, hands on problem solving tasks based on industry standards and certifications. Sandburg students had an excellent showing taking home two gold medals, two silver medals, and two bronze medals!

District 230 to Check Residency Annually

In the district's ongoing efforts to be fiscally responsible, all District 230 students need to show proof of residency within the district boundaries on an annual basis, similar to when students first enrolled at Carl Sandburg High School. This procedure has been put into place to protect the financial interest of taxpayers in District 230 by assuring that the students who receive an education in our schools are legally entitled to do so.

The final day to complete this process will be held on Saturday, May 7, 2016 from 8:00 am - 12:00 noon in the Commons. Please park in the West lot and enter through the W8 door (After Hours Entrance).

2016-2017 Schedules Available In August

Student class schedules for 2016-2017 will be available at Schedule Pick-Up in August.

Course changes can be made during the first five days of the semester. Level change requests can be discussed with teachers and department chairs any time during the first or third quarters. **Requests for teacher preferences are not a valid reason for a schedule change.**

PSAT/NMSQT Testing

(Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test)

The PSAT will be administered to juniors in the fall of 2016. We will communicate the official testing date once it becomes available. This is a practice test used to assist students in preparing for the SAT. Results include an estimated SAT score. A student who does well on this exam and who meets other academic criteria may qualify for the National Merit Scholarship Program. National Merit Scholars are the nation's top 1% of all test takers and are eligible for certain scholarships. FREE Official SAT Practice

The College Board has partnered with Khan Academy to offer free SAT test prep to students. Students should create their account now to view full-length practice tests, short quizzes, practice questions, video lessons, tips and feedback on their progress.

Mechanical CAD Students Take 1st, 2nd, and 3rd at Technology Challenge Competition

On Friday, April 15th, Moraine Valley Community College hosted the MVCC/MACs Technology Challenge where students from Argo, Reavis, Richards, Shepard, Eisenhower, Oak Lawn, Stagg, Andrew and Sandburg High Schools competed in a final round within five areas of Applied Technology. IT Essentials (computers), MDT (CAD), Photoshop (Graphic Arts), Electronics, and Automotive. Sandburg Applied Technology competed in the CAD divisions which encompassed both 2D and 3D competitions. Sandburg qualified six students to move on to the final round.

In 3D CAD, Students used a 3D modeling software program called Inventor. They were tasked with completing a 3D model of a drawing problem within a two hour time frame. The drawing was then graded by Moraine Valley Instructors. Sandburg's Tom Panozzo earned First Place Overall by narrowly beating out another Sandburg Student, David Stevens, who took home Second Place. Ben Mars also qualified for the competition.

In 2D CAD, Students used AutoCAD in which they had to complete a mechanical drawing in a two hour time frame. Sandburg's Eric Eitzen finished Third Place Overall. Jimmy Sommer and Zach Poe also qualified and competed at the competition. Congratulations to all who competed and CAD instructor, Chris Komer.

News From The Nurse's Office

Health Record Requirements For Incoming Freshmen

According to Illinois School Code, all incoming Freshmen must have a complete physical prior to entry into high school, including an up-to-date immunization record before receiving a class schedule. All students are required to have:

- Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis series; Tdap booster
- Two (2) doses of measles, mumps, rubella vaccine (MMR)-1st dose having been given on or after the 1st birthday
- Polio vaccine series with booster given on or after the 4th birthday
- Two (2) doses of varicella vaccine (the 1st dose having been given on or after the 1st birthday)
- Three (3) doses of Hepatitis B according to the required schedule
- One dose of Meningococcal vaccine after the 16th birthday or two doses 8 weeks apart is required for all *seniors*

The form for the physical is two sided.

- Your physician must sign and date to verify immunization record and again after the physical portion with his/her stamp, including phone number.
- Parents must complete and sign a comprehensive health history. This is a mandated portion of the state's physical form and it is on the top of the second page of the physical. Please be sure that all signatures are present before returning your form to school.
- The nurse is required by law to **RETURN** any physicals **NOT** in

compliance with the law. **DOUBLE CHECK** that all signatures are present.

- *Always make a copy for your records.*

Important reminders

- Each student must also have a **pink emergency sheet** on file in the Nurse's Office.
- Please remember that no student will be able to receive their schedule for the 2016-2017 school year until all medical records are in compliance with the state law and on file in the Nurse's Office.
- Send your forms in as soon as they are complete to avoid a delay in getting your class schedule.
- The Nurse's Office is closed in the summer. Physical and emergency forms are available in the Main Office, Guidance Office or online during the summer.
- Dental Examinations strongly recommended but not required for entrance into school.
- **Completed forms should be mailed or turned into the Nurse's Office by May 20, 2016.**

Reminder For Freshmen Athletes

If a student is planning to participate in a sport, his/her physical needs to be obtained on or after May 1, 2016 to assure eligibility for the complete school year.

- Please make sure the doctor circles YES for interscholastic sports.
- This must be done prior to the student trying out for a sport.
- Keep a copy, give a copy to your coach and send the *original* to the Nurse.

SENIORS –

Pick up College Immunization Records

Seniors who need to provide a copy of their immunization record to their college should request a copy from the Nurse's Office by Friday, May 6th. The Nurse is not in during the summer and records are not available without advanced notice. Immunization records for students who do not pick them up will be given to students with their diploma.

Lost Eyeglasses??

The Nurse's Office has prescription eye glasses that have been lost by students throughout the school year. Please have your student stop by the Nurse's Office before the end of the school year if they have lost or misplaced their eyeglasses. Any glasses left in our office at the end of May will be donated at the end of the school year.

Nurse's Office Alert

Attention Junior Parents/Guardians (Class of 2017)

Two doses of Meningococcal vaccine are required for entry to the 12th grade.

Only one dose is required if it was given after the 16th birthday.

The following action is needed from you at this time:

- If your child has received 2 doses of meningococcal vaccine, please bring your physician verified immunization record to the Nurse's Office.
- If your child received 1 dose after their 16th birthday, bring your physician verified immunization record to the Nurse's Office.
- If your child has not had this required vaccine, they must have it and bring the verification of having received it to the Nurse's Office.

If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the Nurse's office at (708) 671-3118.

Medications At School:

Please pick up medications in the Nurse's Office by the last day of school. Medication not picked up will be discarded.

If your student takes medication at school, please remember to send a new Medication Form prior to the start of the 2016-2017 school year. This form needs to be updated each school year for your student to continue receiving his/her medication.

ATTENTION Parents of Incoming Sophomore, Junior and Senior students:

If there are any changes in emergency contact or health information, please complete a new pink emergency form and turn it into the school nurse.

Architectural CAD Student Takes 2nd at State Competition

On Saturday, April 16th, Sandburg students competed in the 39th annual State Drafting/CAD contest sponsored by the Illinois Drafting Educators Association at Illinois State University. The competition included over 100 students from high schools across the state. Sandburg students had a great showing competing in two divisions. Taking 2nd place in State in the Architectural 2D CAD division was Max Drada. Max had previously won 1st place at the Moraine Valley Regional to qualify for State. At the State competition, Architecture students were challenged to create a floor plan and elevation drawing of a house in a two-hour time frame. The drawings were judged on completion, accuracy, neatness, and creativity and were graded by ISU professors. Dan Neubaum also qualified for State and competed in the Introductory CAD division. Dan qualified for State by taking 1st place at the Moraine Valley Regional. At the competition, Introductory CAD students were challenged to complete a 3-View technical drawing in a two-hour time frame. This ties the best showing at State for Sandburg students. Congratulations to both of them!
