## MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Greetings Eagle Families and Friends,

Last month, we enjoyed the opportunity to meet with parents at our annual Parent-Teacher Conferences to communicate student academic progress. There is a substantial amount of research (See the National Center for Education Statistics) that indicates a direct correlation between parent involvement and a student's gpa. We are thankful for our parent participation in the conferences and in other activities like



PFSA, Music Boosters, and Athletic Boosters, and how that partnership contributes to the overall development of our Eagle students. As we welcomed the Class of 2021 at our October Open House, PFSA President Brigid Carey noted that each of her three children found a pathway to success that started at Sandburg and that she expects no less for her 4th child who will enter high school next year. We appreciate that confidence and promise to do all that we can to live up to it.

To that end, we are determined to implement a successful school improvement plan which we introduced to the Education Committee last month. We consistently frame our school improvement plan around four assumptions:

- That the plan must be in service to the district plan
- That we must believe we have room to grow
- That we must be united in the efforts we undertake, and
- That we must "focus relentlessly on matters related to student achievement" (Dylan William)

The October progress report to the Education Committee is posted to our website under "About Sandburg." We look forward to sharing future updates with you throughout the year

Of course, school improvement planning is driven by many and varied data points. Before we endeavor to focus on any one component of school life, we analyze information from as many stakeholders as we can. One of those data points that has informed our plan comes from the Illinois 5Essentials Survey administered to staff, students and parents every other year. Developed by the University of Chicago Consortium on Chicago School Research, the 5Essentials survey yields a comprehensive picture of a school environment based on five areas that research has deemed critical for ongoing school improvement:

- **Effective Leaders** where the principal works with teachers to implement a clear and strategic vision for school success
- **Collaborative Teachers** where a staff is committed to the school, receives strong professional development, and works together to improve the school
- **Involved Families** who build strong relationships with the entire school staff to support learning
- **Supportive Environment** which demonstrates a safe and orderly school in which teachers have high expectations for students and support students to realize their goals and a place where students support each other
- **Ambitious Instruction** where classes are academically demanding and engage students by emphasizing the application of knowledge

This year, Sandburg will administer this survey for the third time since its development. While it is a mandated survey by the State of Illinois, this mandated survey provides very useful information about our performance in the above mentioned five essential areas of school success as long as a certain percentage of stakeholders take the survey. Two years ago, we received the staff and student results but did not receive the parent results because less than 20 percent of our families participated in the survey.

On behalf of everyone here at Sandburg, I encourage you to give voice to future school improvement plans by taking the survey. Parent participation is a critical piece to our full understanding of our strengths and weaknesses. The 25 minute research-based survey will be available from **November 16, 2016 through January 16, 2017**. ## COLLEGE APPLICATION DEADLINE APPROACHING

Several colleges and universities have priority application deadlines that fall between November 1st and December 1st, 2016. Scholarship or talent grant money often has an early deadline of November 1st to December 1st as well.

Each college or university handles these dates in their own way; therefore, it is important for each senior and their parents/guardians to check the schools in which they are applying for the specific deadlines.

Many schools accept applications after December 1st, so no senior should think that they have missed the opportunity to apply to college if they send in their application after November 1st. It is important for students and parents/guardians to continue to communicate with their individual counselor regarding post high school plans.

## CLASS OF 2021 PLACEMENT TESTING



With October comes rain, cooler temperatures, beautiful color and **Arttober!** Illinois officially celebrates the fine arts during October and Sandburg is excited to be a part of the celebration. This month is all about sharing our love of art with the entire Sandburg community. The Art Department began our month with Window Art, designed and created by students in A.P. Studio Art. Students were required to visually represent an economical, environmental, political or social message to peers and adults. A special thanks to Mr. Randy Konsoer for his help in displaying the work in the windows.

Week 1 of **Arttober** included a workshop for students from Drawing, Painting and AP Studio Art classes. Visiting artist **Sarah Rehmer**, back for a fifth time, taught students the historic technique of painting with *encaustics*, a combination of pigments and hot wax. Sarah demonstrated how to mix pigments

with wax on a heated palette, and apply the mixture to specially prepared boards. Each student produced two works using this technique that is currently enjoying a renaissance with exhibiting professional artists all over the country.

Ceramic artist **Ryan Michel** visited students in Beginning & Advanced Ceramics classes. Ryan, an alumni of Andrew High School and a working artist, presented a lecture, demonstration and an art installation. Students were impressed with Ryan's sculptural work, which represents animal adaptations in a modern world.
