


It's a great day to be an Eagle!

All freshmen and transfer students started their first day as an Eagle on Wednesday, August 17th. The day started out with an assembly and welcome from both Mrs. Baker and Joel John, our Student Council President. After the assembly, students broke off into groups and attended six informational sessions.

- Skyward Student Access, setting passwords, Gmail, and completed a Google survey asking about grit and connectedness.
- Co-Curricular Fair – All teams and co-curriculars were represented to give information on their club/sport.
- The Deans' Office highlighted the Student Handbook, including rules and expectations, and Service Learning requirements.

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MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Greetings Eagle Families and Friends,

We started the new school year thinking about "impact" and reflecting on how our individual and collective efforts will positively impact school climate, culture, and, most especially, academic achievement. We know that the hard work of realizing our growing potential comes with setting goals. We are, therefore, preparing action plans to address three focus areas of this year's school improvement plan: Learning (that includes teacher learning, too!), Interventions, and Connectedness. I look forward to the opportunity to share progress reports toward these goals over the course of this year.

Speaking of impact: two major summer construction projects yielded great improvements to our campus. Our Eagle Gym sports brand new bleachers and a sparkling refinished and repainted floor that displays our formal athletic logo. Students tell me that the space has never looked better. The second project addressed the W8 Entrance (from the west lot) which now has a security office and a new and deeper awning to announce the west lot entrance and to protect against inclement weather. In addition to those two construction projects, and to support and embed technology improvements in the school, our Athletic Hall of Fame is going digital. Years and years of information will soon be available from three different touch screen monitors that are installed at entrances to the Eagle Gym and Hall of Fame.

Our first week of school was packed with activities: Two Institute Days, Frosh/Transfer Day, Chromebook distribution to freshman and sophomore students, Dean's Talks, and a first-ever Sandburgfest on Friday, August 19th, as a special welcome back activity intended for all students. Dozens of our Eagles bounced through several inflatables, flew down a zip line and enjoyed a huge BBQ before the annual Blue & Gold Scrimmage game. DJ Lance provided music in the south end zone that added a festival feel to the event. At 5:00 pm, several community groups, including the Pioneers, joined the fun. We expect that this event will have a long-lasting impact by becoming a new tradition here at Sandburg.

Sometimes, grit is required if impact is to be achieved. Almost five years ago, a group of highly motivated and very determined Sandburg Science teachers began a journey to pursue an innovative idea to build a Passive House and an outdoor learning center - a separate learning space on the west side of our campus that would be used for Science, Technology, Engineering, Math, and Art classes, among other content areas. Several drafts of architectural plans and construction costs later, a grant application submitted by this group, headed up by Chris Borst, has advanced to one of the final steps in the grant approval process. We are hopeful but continue to welcome funding partners to this endeavor. As excited as we are about the possibility that a passive house offers, we took time in late August to celebrate and recognize the impact of legacy by two Eagle alum. On Friday, August 26th, dozens of alum, friends, and family witnessed the unveiling of new sign announcing the "Mike Navarro Stadium" to honor the many accomplishments of Mike Navarro, Class of '69, retired PE teacher ('07), and dedicated football coach.



Then, on Sunday, August 28th, Sandburg's Family Fun Committee hosted a Splash Bash to honor the great sense of fairness, determination, and courage that "Warrior" Jane Caliendo imparted on all of us here at Sandburg. The newly named "Jane Caliendo Aquatic Center" honors Jane not only as a diligent and hard-working student-athlete ('86), but especially for two decades of success as a teacher, mentor, and coach to our students, athletes and colleagues across the SWSC Conference.



In advisories, our students have spent a lot of time talking about and thinking about goals for themselves. We'll do our best to help them achieve them, but here are a few suggestions that we hope you will reinforce with your children in helping them achieve the goals they set for themselves:

- Focus on one goal
- Break that goal into small, manageable steps
- Share the goal with a friend who will be supportive and who will hold you accountable
- Celebrate every success and milestone - no matter how small
- Embrace the "Can Do" spirit - even if the original plan or step goes awry; adjust and move forward.



Perfect ACT Score

Olivia Paraschos earned the highest possible ACT Composite score of 36. On average, less than one-tenth of 1% of all test takers earns the top score. Among ACT-tested US high school graduates in the class of 2017, only 1,598 out of 1.92 million students earned an ACT Composite score of 36.

Reminders: Important Test Dates and Information

PSAT Testing

All juniors will be taking the mandatory PSAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test on Wednesday, October 19 from 8:00 - 11:30 am. After completion of the test, students will return to their normal class schedule. The PSAT/NMSQT provides the school with important information, is practice for

the April SAT which all juniors will take, and serves as the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test for juniors.

ASVAB at Sandburg

Students interested in military careers are invited to take the ASVAB exam on Thursday, October 6th. The results of this intelligence and career exam may provide useful information and does not

require the student to enlist in the military. Interested seniors should see Mrs. Erin Hawes in the Guidance Office for more information.

National Defense Authorization Act

This act allows military representatives to ask for unedited lists of juniors and seniors. The school will provide student directory information unless parents send an email to Mrs. Meredith Sheriff,

Guidance Director (msherriff@d230.org), indicating that they do not want their child's name and directory information provided to military recruiters.

Deans' Office

The Deans met with all students' advisory classes during the month of August to discuss behavior expectations for the 2016-2017 school year. To ensure that our building is safe and orderly, students are asked to focus on the following points of emphasis for this school year:

TARDY POLICY

Tardies are **CUMULATIVE** for all classes for one semester. Students are notified of each tardy by their teacher. The following consequences result after a student accumulates four tardies:

- 5th tardy: 1-hour detention
- 6th and 7th tardies: two 1-hour detentions (for each tardy)
- 8th and 9th tardies: one 3-hour detention (for each tardy)
- 10th tardy and beyond: Deans issued consequence (Detention, In-School, Loss of Privilege, Out-of-School Suspension)

BULLYING/CYBERBULLYING

BULLYING OF ANY KIND WILL NOT BE TOLERATED

- All students have a right to attend school without other students attempting to intimidate or act aggressively toward them. Students who **repeatedly act** aggressively toward another student or who coerce other students to threaten or intimidate other students will also receive consequences through the Deans' Office.
- In addition, students who engage in cyber-bullying through the use of technology (Facebook posting, inappropriate texting or phone calls—on campus or off-campus) will also receive consequences if their actions create a disruption at school. Consequences may range from detentions to possible out of school suspension depending upon the severity of the issue and may involve the Orland Park Police.

ACADEMIC INTEGRITY

District 230 seeks to establish an atmosphere in each classroom which actively fosters academic integrity. Definitions of academic dishonesty are included but not limited to: cheating, intentionally plagiarizing, wrongfully giving or receiving help during an academic examination, wrongfully obtaining test copies or scores, etc

- Consequences may range from receiving 0's on assignments to detentions or suspensions through the Deans' Office
- Documentation is kept for all 4 years at Sandburg
- Violations affect membership in athletics, eligibility for National Honor Society, local scholarships, and college admission

DRESS CODE

Please note the following warm-weather dress code guidelines:

- Pants must be worn at the waist with top attire touching bottom attire
- All undergarments must be covered by outer attire
- See through attire is not permitted
- Skirts or shorts must extend below the fingertips/arms hanging to the side (Same rule applies to slits in skirts and rips in jeans)
- Tops must cover shoulders and back
- Spaghetti straps are not allowed
- Straps must be three-fingers in width
- Tops must not be low cut or revealing

Please refer to the Student Handbook for a complete description of the guidelines for appropriate school attire. Students may receive disciplinary consequences for violating the dress code.

UPDATED CELL PHONE/ELECTRONIC DEVICE POLICY

- Students may use personal devices in the common areas including lunch rooms, Commons, hallways, Media Centers, mezzanines, and exterior school grounds.
- Ear buds are permitted with volume inaudible for others and must be used when listening to music or recordings on cell phones or electronic devices.
- Over-the-ear headphones, i.e. Beats and Bluetooth speakers; are prohibited.
- Devices must be off and out of sight in locker rooms, washroom, and detention areas.
- At the discretion of the teacher, students may use personal devices in classrooms, Media Centers, and computer labs

(Note: this is not a change - this has always been at the discretion of the teacher).

CAMPUS SAFETY AND SECURITY

Our Main Entrance is located at Door E-11, located in the circle drive on the east side (LaGrange Road side) of the building. Doors will have an attendant between the hours of 7:00 am and 4:00 pm. The After Hours Entrance is located at Door W-8 located in the west lof off of 131st Street. Doors will have an attendant between the hours of 3:30 – 9:30 pm. The Grill Area continues to serve food and beverages from 3:00 – 6:00 pm, Monday through Friday. Students remaining after school for activities, practices and/or events can purchase snacks or dinner during these hours. Debit cards can be used. There is no need for a student to leave campus when participating in after-school activities.

Please reinforce the messages we share with students here at school regarding their personal belongings. Students should not bring items to school that are not needed for their daily classes and activities. IPOD's, large sums of money and other valuables should be left at home. We strive to maintain a safe and secure environment for our students and staff; please encourage your child to help in this effort.

PARKING

Parking on campus is a senior privilege for those who have completed their 24 hours of Community Service. Parking passes were distributed on Wednesday, August 24th.

Those needing a one-day parking pass should call the Temporary Parking Hotline at 671-3575 24 hours in advance to insure a parking space. Information is also available on the Deans' Office web page.

SAFER TRAFFIC PATTERNS

School Resource Officer Shuster has created a designated traffic pattern for student drivers for parking and leaving campus at 3:00 p.m. Students have been instructed to pull into parking spaces to park and follow designed (one way) traffic patterns down the lanes to exit the lot. This has been a successful plan that creates a safer traffic environment for our students, staff and buses. For the safety of all, the speed limit on campus is 10 mph.

ANONYMOUS SAFETY AND SECURITY TIP LINE

Carl Sandburg High School has a Safety and Security Tip Line that is checked on a daily basis by the deans. The purpose of this 24-hour line is to provide parents and students with an opportunity to leave a message related to Safety and Security with a dean. News From The Nurse's Office

VISION and HEARING SCREENING

During the entire school year, the Nurse's Office provides vision and hearing screening for students.

Signs of hearing loss can include the inability to tolerate loud sounds, poor speech, speaking in a relatively loud voice, and often hearing a ringing or buzzing sound in the ears. It is especially important for students to lower the volume in their CD and IPOD headsets and wear ear protection when necessary. If others can hear the music from these headsets, it is too loud!

Signs of vision problems can include frequent headaches, squinting, sitting nearer to the television, and holding a book or magazine closer.

If you have a concern and would like to have your child screened during the school year, please call the Nurse's Office at 708-671-3118.

Parents, if you are concerned about your own hearing, you can arrange to take a free, one minute Dial A Hearing Screening Test at 1-800-222-3277. It is offered Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm. It is quick, easy, fun, and may indicate further follow-up.

"Vision screening is not a substitute for a complete eye and vision examination by an eye doctor. Your child is not required to undergo this vision screening if an optometrist or ophthalmologist has completed and signed a report form indicating that an examination has been administered within the previous 12 months".

ORLAND TOWNSHIP FLU SHOTS

Orland Township will be offering flu shots to residents from September 22nd – October 22nd. Residents 18 years of age and under who do not have insurance that covers the flu shot, or have Medicaid, may receive the shot free of charge. Otherwise, the cost is \$25.00. All residents 19 and older will pay \$25.00. Vaccines will be given on most Mondays from 4:30 – 7:00 p.m. and most Wednesdays from 3:00 – 7:00 p.m. There is one Saturday date on October 4th from 9:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. **No appointment is necessary.** Please call 403-4222 or visit www.orlandtownship.org for further information.

LAGRANGE ROAD CONSTRUCTION

District 230 and Carl Sandburg Administration have been meeting with officials from the Illinois Department of Transportation and the Village of Orland Park regarding the ongoing LaGrange Road construction project. We will be cooperating with these agencies to insure that all students arrive and leave campus in a safe and orderly fashion. As we receive information from IDOT and the village, we will communicate with the families of all of our students to keep the entire community as informed as possible.

For students that do not utilize D230 provided transportation, drop-off and pick up before and after school are permitted only in the North Parking Lot. Please do not allow students to enter or exit vehicles on LaGrange Road or 131st Street.

During the duration of the LaGrange Road construction project, we ask that students do not get dropped off at businesses located across LaGrange Road from the school. For their safety, students should not walk through an active construction zone.

We have received notice from our local retailers that they have "enlisted the services of Ambassador Car Carriers, Inc. to monitor" their parking lot according to Sandburg's event schedule. "Any student or visitor who parks their vehicle in the shopping center and leaves the center to attend a high school event is at risk of being towed at their own expense." Please plan accordingly.
