

# MODEL UN CONFERENCE

**Sandburg Model United Nations** hosted its eighth annual conference (CSMUN VIII) on Saturday, September 30th. The conference was staffed by 42 current Sandburg students, as well as 5 Sandburg Alumni. 600 Delegates came from all over the state of Illinois to debate a variety of issues including the Opium Wars, Great Britain's Parliament, the US Senate, and Queen Elizabeth's Court, as well as to simulate current relations between nearly every continent alike. New to one-day Model UN conferences was pilot committee: The Press, which featured 8 delegates asking note of the activity in each room as it occurred, releasing three newspaper additions in total.



Our conference was also proud to feature students as keynote speakers from five schools represented at this year's event. Speaking on behalf of their experiences with finding their voice in Model UN, the commendable speeches from each delegate instilled drive in an auditorium full of listeners.

# ENGLISH DEPARTMENT

The first annual College Essay Boot Camp took place October 2nd - 6th and was a rousing success! Hosted by the staff of Sandburg's Literacy Lab (with aid from the English Department), this program was developed to help college-bound seniors prepare for the increasingly rigorous essay writing process for college applications and scholarships. Throughout the week, seniors had the opportunity to participate in a variety of presentations, workshops, and individualized help sessions to assist them in completing their personal essays. The Boot Camp also offered advice from college admissions counselors to both students and parents and provided practical assistance to senior students writing essays for college.

The Literacy Lab staff and English Department were extremely proud of our participating students. (Over 170 senior students received assistance over the course of the week!) We watched these students work hard, take on challenges, and grow in confidence. The visiting admissions counselors noticed as well and remarked on these qualities, as well as the high caliber of Sandburg students' writing.

We are proud to have offered this kind of support - made possible by the generous contributions of the D230 Foundation - and are excited to build on the tremendous success of the College Essay Boot Camp in the future.

## COLLEGE APPLICATION DEADLINE APPROACHING

Several colleges and universities have priority application deadlines that fall between November 1st and December 1st, 2017. Scholarship or talent grant money often has an early deadline of November 1st to December 1st as well.

Each college or university handles these dates in their own way; therefore, it is important for each senior and their parents/guardians to check the schools in which they are applying for

the specific deadlines.

Many schools accept applications after December 1st, so no senior should think that they have missed the opportunity to apply to college if they send in their application after November 1st. It is important for students and parents/guardians to continue to communicate with their individual counselor regarding post high school plans.

## SERVICE LEARNING GRADUATION REQUIREMENT

This is an important reminder for Sandburg Seniors. In addition to earning credit for completion of required courses for graduation, all students in District 230 must complete 24 Service Learning hours. Please be certain that documentation of your hours is turned into our Service Learning Secretary, Mrs. Nancy Kermer, in the Community Service Office located in the Media Center. You may also see Mrs. Kermer for assistance in finding service

projects and to secure pre-approval for service that you would like to complete.

Early Graduate's hours are due no later than Wednesday, November 22; and Year-End Graduate's hours are due no later than Friday, December 22.


### What is CTE?

CTE stands for Career and Technical Education. Sandburg hosts three departments under the CTE umbrella: Family and Consumer Sciences, Applied Technology and Business. CTE classes give high school students the chance to get a head start on preparing for college and careers. A few hands-on CTE classes offered at Sandburg are Culinary Arts, Child Development and Preschool Teaching, CAD, Auto, Accounting, Woodworking and Fashion & Interior design. These classes give students real-world experiences, nationally recognized certifications and dual credit at Moraine Valley.

Hegeman from the Media Center showcasing the current outstanding need for women in manufacturing. The students gave up their lunch for these three days to learn about various job opportunities, were introduced to numerous machines in the woodshop and were able to have their last names programmed into the Shop Bot machine. In the end, each student took home a large, wooden name sign for a potential Christmas gift for their parents as well as an abundance of knowledge of manufacturing. Reactions from the students were abundantly positive and Mr. Diorio encouraged signing up for his future manufacturing/ woodworking classes. ## MUSIC DEPARTMENT

There's a whole new sound coming from the Sandburg High School Vocal Program. Our students have been working hard since the beginning of the year to create a sound more indicative of larger, professional choirs.
