Dylan Jacobs rebounded from illness after the Illinois State meet by winning the Footlocker U.S. National Cross Country Championship on December 9th in San Diego, California. The Footlocker National Championships have been run since 1979 to determine the best individual high school runner in the country. The top 40 boys in the country competed in a head to head race in San Diego's historic Balboa Park in what is known as the more prestigious cross country race course in the country. In the process, Sandburg became the first high school in U.S. history to produce two National Champions. Fittingly, Sandburg's first national champion, Lukas Verzbicas (pictured on the left) was holding the finish line as Dylan broke through to make history.

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## MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Greetings Eagle Families and Friends,

On behalf of everyone here at Sandburg, Happy New Year to all! I hope you enjoyed the holiday season and your family time. The winter break certainly provided me with an opportunity to reflect on some of our experiences starting last July, when we hosted a 50th reunion tour of the school and campus. The forty people who travelled far and wide to come back for a visit were impressed with the physical changes of Sandburg, but became most excited upon entering the south building - the original structure. At that point, the memories and names from the past came flooding back. With a satisfied smile, one gentleman recalled exactly where his locker was (still remembering the combination!) and another alum could picture herself at a sock hop in the Blue Gym. Not everything was total recall, though. Assistant Principal, Greg Gardner, and I observed that none of our visitors recollected the hard stuff: long nights of homework, exam preparation, and seriously bad hair days. Half a century later, though, it seemed like all of these golden alum, in their reminiscing, attributed some of their success to their experiences at Sandburg. As Principal, that made me proud to know that time and distance did not consign the high school years to irrelevance.

Fast forward about 40 years to another alumni group - the 30 Under 30 - whose post-secondary journeys will be featured in a special newsletter to be published by Sandburg early in 2018. Unlike their 50th anniversary counterparts, the hard part of the high school experience continues to resonate, but as these younger alumni travel forward into successful professions and endeavors, they shared an appreciation for the sweat equity that they learned as Eagles, acknowledging that Sandburg staff taught them how to view failure as an opportunity to learn, how to overcome fear, and how to set and achieve goals. As Principal, I am equally proud that the collective reflections of this alumni group validates our belief that hard work is as much a part of the learning process as the content that we deliver.

Sandburg was originally built to serve 450 students; we now have 3,000. How we prepare students for post-secondary life has evolved according to the changing interests, needs, and requirements over the years. That being said, no matter the decade, era, or generation of students, we know that our ongoing success requires effort and hard work, which has been recognized by publications like the **Washington Post** ("Most Challenging Schools;") **Newsweek** (Distinguished School;) and **Niche.com** (Top 20 in Illinois.) Congratulations to you, parents and families. We know that your partnership and support of our efforts cannot be understated. We also know that embedded in these recognitions are specific successes highlighted below related to the three focus areas (Learning, Interventions and Connectedness) of our school improvement plan that are framed by a collective mindset to insure that every day is a GREAT day to be an Eagle!

## 2018 ILLINOIS STATE SCHOLARS NAMED

Carl Sandburg High school is pleased to announce that 117 students from the graduating class of 2018 have been recognized as Illinois State Scholars.

The Illinois Student Assistance Commission (ISAC), the state agency committed to helping to make college accessible and affordable for Illinois families, bestows this prestigious recognition to top Illinois high school students annually. This year, over 18,800 elite honorees join the other top state students honored for their academic achievements since the designation was first introduced in 1958.

Illinois State Scholars represent approximately the top ten percent of high school seniors, hailing from 671 different high schools across the state. Selection is based on SAT or ACT scores and/or class rank at the end of the junior year.

It is with great pride that we announce this year's group of Illinois State Scholars. Congratulations to our State Scholars for their commitment and hard work. We also want to commend their parents, teachers, coaches and mentors for helping these students achieve their goals.

## Course Selection

Course Selection for the next school year is about to begin. Students should see their counselor as soon as possible if they have any questions about their four-year plans or credits. Counselors will schedule individual student appointments and the schedule will be posted on the window in the Commons. Registration appointments will occur during the following dates:

Students must check the posted appointment schedules and report

**directly to the Guidance Office at their appointed time to meet with their counselor.** Registration materials will be provided to your student prior to registration during their Advisory class. Students are to bring their completed registration sheet with them to the appointment with their counselor. Pay particular attention to courses required for graduation and be sure to observe course sequences. **All prerequisites for a course must be met before taking the course.** Also note that some courses require additional fees. ## HEALTH OFFICE UPDATE FOR JUNIORS

All students entering 12th grade in the state of Illinois are required to have proof of having received the **Meningococcal** vaccine. **The following action is needed from you at this time:**

Verification of one of the following:

- A dose of Meningococcal vaccine administered on or after your child's 16th birthday

**Proof of having received the Meningococcal vaccine is required and should be submitted to the School Nurse as soon as the vaccine is given but no later than May 25, 2018.**

**Your student's healthcare provider should complete either the form mailed to you in December (This form can also be found on the nurse's webpage) or provide their own documentation that this vaccination requirement is completed. The verification can be:**

- Dropped off in the Nurse's Office
- Mailed to Carl Sandburg High School, Attention: Nurse's Office
- Scanned and emailed to the Nurse's Office at [ncassidy@d230.org](mailto:ncassidy@d230.org), OR
- Faxed to the Nurse at 708/737-7721

### A Healthy Reminder from the Nurse's Office

Should your student become ill, it is **VERY IMPORTANT** that they come to the Nurse's Office and contact you on the phones available to them here. A student feeling ill at school should obtain a pass from their teacher to see the nurse. This will assure your student's presence in the Nurse's Office if you are picking them up. It also provides the opportunity for us to monitor your child's

condition as we await your arrival. The parent/parent designee must come inside to the Front Door (E-II) with a photo I.D. to sign the student out. Students should remain at home until at least 24 hours after they are free of a fever (100 degrees and higher) without the use of fever reducing medication such as Acetaminophen or Ibuprofen.

### A Reminder of the Medication Policy

Students should not take medication during school hours or at school related activities unless it is necessary for the student's health and well-being.

All medication is to be stored in the Nurse's Office. A student should not carry prescription or non-prescription medications with them. Exceptions include insulin, inhalers and epinephrine with the School Medication Authorization Form on file.

If a student **MUST** take a medication at school, including over the counter medications such as acetaminophen, Ibuprofen, antibiotics, eye drops, etc., the student must provide the nurse with a written order for the medication from a licensed healthcare provider, as well as the parent's written signature on the School Medication

Authorization Form. Any medication administered in the Nurse's Office will be recorded in the student's health record.

Forms to allow the administration of medication at school are available in the Nurse's Office or on the Nurse's webpage at <http://sandburg.d230.org/resources/nurses-office/>

If the student requests to call home for medication during the school day, they must call from the Nurse's Office. A parent **MUST** come into the Nurse's Office, meet the student and administer the medication to the student. Medications **cannot** be left in the Nurse's Office or at the Front Door for a student to pick up. Students are not permitted to carry, to dispense or to receive any medication from other students.

Lastly, remember to contact the Nurse's Office or the Guidance Office with any changes in your student's contact information, such as home, work or cell numbers.

Thank you for your cooperation with this very important matter.


